About Us

Cumberland County Council on Older Adults is a nonprofit organization founded in 1968 to help address the needs of our aging population. Our mission is to help older adults maintain their independence at home.

We fulfill our mission by providing a variety of home and community-based supportive services that help older adults and those caring for older adults achieve their desired goal to remain at home and in their community.

Services are provided at no cost to eligible older adults who are age 60 and older (some programs 65 and older) and who reside within Cumberland County. Each program is unique and offers services and/or volunteer opportunities which support our mission.





Information & Assistance Services

Informs seniors or those acting on their behalf about local, state and federal resources that may be available to address their needs. Assists seniors who have difficulty following through on the information given by making referrals and/or advocating on their behalf.

Options Counseling

Offers a person-centered approach to talking about long-term options based on the needs and preferences of older adults and their caregivers by supporting individual informed choices, connecting the individual to services and follow-up.

Home Delivered Meals (Meals on Wheels)

Delivers nutritious meals to homebound older adults who are unable to prepare meals for themselves and have no one willing or able to provide meals for them. Volunteers delivering meals also provide much needed social contact and wellness checks.

Congregate Lunch Program

Provides nutritious noon-time meals at designated community sites while creating an opportunity for social interaction and activities.

In-Home Aide Services

Assists older adults with personal care and home management needs through certified nursing assistants and/or personal care assistants supervised by registered nurses.

Home Improvement Services

Improves the mobility and stability of older adults by installing accessibility equipment such as ramps, handrails, grab bars etc. Enhances the safety of older adults by installing security features such as door/window locks, etc.

Senior Companion Program

Connects older adults with volunteers who provide companionship within the home to ease loneliness and social isolation, help to serve as eyes and ears to professionals who can provide additional assistance, and give support to informal caregivers. May be able to assist with transportation and light chores.

Telephone Reassurance Program

Connects older adults experiencing social isolation and loneliness with volunteers to provide regular telephone contact. Calls are primarily provided to increase social contact through conversation and to check on the safety and well-being of the older adult.

Alzheimer's Disease & Related Dementia Community Support & Awareness

Supports the older adult community with dementiarelated diagnoses and their caregivers through such resources as Alzheimer's Foundation of Americasponsored memory screenings, caregiver classes and community presentations, respite funds to provide family caregivers a break, and personalized Dementia Alliance of NC-sponsored Music and Memory at Home kits.

Caregiver Support Services

Supports caregivers of older adults through such resources as caregiver classes including Assisting Older Adults and the evidence-based Powerful Tools for Caregivers program, and both virtual and in-person caregiver support groups.

Seniors' Health Insurance Information Program

Provides information, personal counseling and public classes relating to Medicare, Medicare supplements, Medicare Advantage and Medicare Part D. Also provides information on Medicare scams and fraud.
